

FUNDING

The total project cost is currently estimated at \$71.2M for basic trail improvements including trail, access points, structure rehab, lighting.

It does not include additional enhancements to the land adjacent to the trail that is being developed through the framework plan.

Thus far, \$20M in the federal RAISE grant has been secured and \$6M in Chicago Works G0 Bond.








HERMITAGE PARK NODE EXISTING VIEW FROM THE TRIAL LOOKING WEST





HERMITAGE PARK NODE PROPOSED VIEW FROM THE TRIAL LOOKING WEST




