Mass Care

- Address the physical and emotional disaster-caused needs of all individuals and families
 - This includes pets and service animals
- Definition of mass care is expanding
 - National Response Framework, ESF #6
 - Population Related Disaster Services



The Red Cross: Mass Care Provider

- Red Cross is country's lead Mass Care provider

- 171 large disaster responses (DRs)
- 34,197 overnight shelter stays
- 404,838 meals served
- 34,070 health and 31,506 mental health contacts
 - Calendar year to-date 2015
- Extensive network of partnerships



The Red Cross: Mass Care Coordinator

- The National Response Framework (NRF)
- ESF #6: Mass Care, Emergency Assistance, Temporary Housing, Human Services
 - National Co-Lead
 - Lead Coordinating Agency in IL
 - Supporting Agency in WI and IN
- ESF # 11: Agriculture and Natural Resources
 - Supporting Agency in IL, WI



Service Animals

- Service animals are permitted in a shelter
- ADA Magic Questions:
 - Do you need this animal because of a disability?
 - What work or tasks has the animal been trained to perform?
- Emotional support animals
- Owner has overall responsibility
- Can only be removed if out of control / not housebroken



Animal Support as a Function of Mass Care

Household Pets

- Household pet support does not fall within the Red Cross mission
 - Will not be allowed in shelters
- Co-locate animal shelters whenever possible
- Community resources and partnerships
 - Supply and logistics
 - Networking
 - Coordinating state support
 - Illinois Veterinary Emergency Response Teams (IVERT)
 - International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW)



Community Support

- Local Organizations
 - Local Humane Societies / Therapy Animal Organizations
 - Veterinary Clinics / Animal Hospitals
 - Stables / Pet Shops
 - County Animal Services (CARTs/DARTs)
- State Support
 - State Veterinary Emergency Response Teams
 - International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW)
- National Memorandums of Understanding
 - American Humane Association
 - American Veterinary Medical Foundation
 - Humane Society of the United States
