### Do's and Don'ts of Starting A County Animal Response Team

## History

- Appointed Animal Control Administrator in 1998
- In 2002 asked by LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee) if I had updated the County Animal Control Plan to include terrorism
- Guess What???

- It did not nor ever did exist
- Embarrassing
- Continued to attend LEPC meetings
- My first exposure to Emergency Management
- Don't be intimidated by Emergency Management language and hierarchy Do you speak FEMite?

- At this time LaSalle County's emergency management consisted of ESDA (Emergency Services and Disaster Agency)
- ESDA was the left over county civil defense
- Almost non functional

- Continued to Flounder in the water over next several years trying to find time and knowledge to write Animal Control Plan
- Attended as many meetings as I could
- Had privilege to be only veterinarian attending the Illinois Terrorism Task Forcea 2 day seminar in May 02

- November 04 attended SART Summit
- Sponsored by IDOA (Illinois Department of Agriculture)
- Theme was building a SART (State Animal Response Team)
- Given by North Carolina (Leaders in Emergency Management)

- IVERT(Illinois Veterinary Emergency Response Team) was already in place
- IVERT took over as SART
- IVERT puts on meeting every year

- Concept of CART (County Animal Response Team) is BORN
- I do not have to do this alone!!!

• Meanwhile Back at the County

- A real LaSalle County EMA(Emergency Management Agency) was formed with an excellent EMA Director, Mike Jobst
- More help
- Worked with Mike to develop the LaSCART (LaSalle County Animal Response Team)

- The best and smartest thing I did!!
- Hand picked volunteers-Excellent people
- Picked for their expertise
- Picked for their ability to PLAY WELL WITH OTHERS!

- Be Careful!!
- Overloaded with Food Animal and Equine members
- Not enough Small Animal members
- Although, everyone cross trained for each team
- Forty-something Team or Fifty-something Team-Not enough young members to pick up the flag for the future

### First Meeting 1-26-06

- Hand Picked volunteers
- Illinois State Police
- Ottawa Police Dept.
- LaSalle County Health Department
- Red Cross
- LaSalle County Board Members
- Animal Control Warden

#### Finances

- Started with ZILCH
- Used Animal Control budget (already run on a shoestring) for office supplies
- 2007 –County board budgeted \$5,000 for us through the County EMA and have continued this through present
- Never know when they will cut you Off!!!!

#### Finances

- Early 08 we received a \$5,000 grant from private foundation- LaSCART member applied for it
- June 08 received \$5,000 grant from LaSalle Nuclear station-because we participated in IPRA (Illinois Plan for Radiological Accidents)exercise
- LaSCART has a seat in the EOC

Grants and Yearly budget from County EMA used to buy Trailers and Equipment

Closed trailer and an open top trailer for gates and a skid

Difficult decisions on equipment purchases!!

- -How much is enough
- -Justifying high dollar equipment that we may never need

### Lessons Learned

- Balance Team better with different expertise
- Balance better with age- Recruit young members as well as us old and wise members!!!!!!!!!
- Get the word out-People still do not know who we are

Do hand pick volunteers that play well together then set membership guides

Don't overload your team with 1-2 types of volunteers

Do get volunteers of all ages- Difficult to find younger volunteers

Don't be afraid to start a CART -Start small and build -Coordinator does not have to be a veterinarian or county employee -Just someone that will commit

Don't try to do it by yourself

Do delegate responsibility and tasks

Don't reinvent the wheel

Find a plan in existence- then change and format the plan to fit your County

## Training

Do train, train and more training

Do field and training exercises

Do table top exercises

#### Don't overload your TEAM with Testing

Require the IS-100 and IS-700 and encourage TEAM to add testing as they progress
