Listening Session held 7/26/22 at Davis Square Park

More than 70 attendees

Discussion covered the following themes: Location and programming, key elements, Concept development considerations



What we heard Location and programming

Residents emphasized importance of an accessible, centrally located new library

Versatile, large multi-purpose space for community use

Multi-generational, culturally relevant programming by bilingual library staff; book collections in Spanish





What we heard Location and programming

Some voiced a preference for a standalone library; others interested in a mixed-use facility with own entry and building

Separate computer lab space and more computers; STEM program options and homework help for youth

Safe location near other community organizations





What we heard

Key elements of the new library

Showcase cultural and neighborhood history in new library design

Modern library design with flexible layout comparable to other newer libraries in the city

Creation of spaces that facilitate social interaction, such as green space





What we heard

Considerations for concept development

City will maintain open communication with community throughout programming and design phase of library concept development

Specific interest in community engagement on library design

Multiple flexible, dividable spaces for community use

Proposed Improvements

- Roadway geometry and intersection improvements
- Full width resurfacing
- Drainage improvements
- New sidewalk, curb, and gutter
- Pedestrian safety improvements
- ADA ramps and crosswalks
- Street lighting
- Traffic signal upgrades
- Pavement markings and signage

- Paver parkways
- Side street improvements to the alleys as needed
- Site furniture and seating areas
- Light pole identifiers
- · Gateway identifiers
- Tree planting and landscaping
- Plaza space on the northeast corner of 47th & Ashland and McDowell and other potential open space improvements.





DEPARTMENT OF PROCUREMENT SERVICES (DPS) PROCESS

- DPS is the centralized contracting, certification, and compliance authority of the City.
- Publicly advertised competitive bid process all businesses can submit a bid!
- City encourages local business to bid on contracts.

DOING BUSINESS WITH THE CITY

- Businesses can bid directly on a contract or indirectly as a subcontractor.
 - Bidding opportunities can be found at www.chicago.gov/bids
 - Prime contractors who have won contract bids select subcontractors for specific tasks (not the City)
 - Opportunity for small businesses to participate on a larger project – connect with Assist Agencies / Network with prime contractors.

SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

- The Small Business Initiative (SBI) is designed to increase the opportunities that small businesses have to do business with the City of Chicago.
- The Small Business Initiative institutes a program for small local businesses to be exclusive bidders on certain construction projects.
- This construction project will fall under the SBI program.
- For eligibility requirements please visit the City's SBI Construction Program website.
- Project will require 7.5 % local hiring.
