

- 3. Include neighborhood vision & goals (draw from past plans)
- 4. Suggest menu of programmatic uses & illustrate urbanism principles
- 5. Assess high-level financial feasibility and necessary incentives



- 1. DPD and sister agencies currently performing detailed review of submissions (December January)
- 2. High-level overview of submissions provided to Roundtable today (December session)
- 3. RFP Respondents to present to the Roundtable in January (likely two sessions)
 - More detailed presentation
 - Ability to ask questions / dive deeper
 - Feedback achieved via quantitative and qualitative methods (see next slide)
 - Compiled community input incorporated into DPD's selection / negotiation process
- 4. Winning respondent selected in February; continued negotiation and community engagement to follow

CORRIDOR MANAGER REVIEW PROCESS



Corridor Manager Review Process



LISC received two applications for the Englewood Invest S/W corridor (after extended deadline):

- **Greater Englewood Chamber of Commerce**
- **Greater Englewood Community Development Corporation (GECDC)**

What is the status of the selection?:

- Both applicants scored well overall, each presenting their own opportunities and challenges
- The Englewood Corridor Manager selection process will be put on hold and resumed later in 2021
- In the meantime, the 16th Ward Development Advisory Council assembled by Ald. Coleman will step in to collaboratively serve as an interim Corridor Manager
