

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

#### Why is CDOT doing this project?

This project is a part of the City's INVEST South/West initiative and is one of several projects being led by multiple City of Chicago agencies.

The INVEST South/West projects are intended to re-activate neighborhood cores that have historically served as focal points for pedestrian activity, shopping, services, transportation, public spaces, and quality-of-life amenities for residents.

The primary goal of this project is to provide a safe, walkable, and attractive street that helps to foster continued economic growth.

### Once an identifier is selected, where will they be placed?

Identifiers are typically placed at "gateway locations", or entrances, to the neighborhood. The vertical identifiers could possibly be placed at 63rd Street and Halsted Street; 63rd Street and Loomis Boulevard; Halsted Street and 59th Street or Halsted Street and 66th Street. If you have any location recommendations, please share your input with the team today. Light pole identifiers will be placed throughout the corridor along 63rd Street and Halsted Street.

#### How were these concept ideas developed?

Over the past two years, the design team has worked to develop concepts based off of existing community efforts surrounding Englewood Rising. Local artist Just Flo was involved in the initial round of concept development. The three concepts celebrate the historical character and success of Englewood while honoring the current and future community.
