

PROJECT OVERVIEW

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Streetscapes consist of infrastructure, pedestrian safety, and placemaking improvements with the goal of creating unified, safe, walkable, and attractive street. The streetscape projects are comprehensive and include public right-of-way improvements from building face to building face.

Part of Chicago Works: Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot's five-year capital plan that will Invest in Communities through Infrastructure.

The Project Includes:

- Public Outreach
- Placemaking and urban design strategy
- Concept design & engineering
- Detailed design & engineering
- Construction of the corridor

The Project Scope:

- Roadway geometry and intersection improvements
- Full width resurfacing
- Drainage improvements
- Sidewalk, curb, and gutter
- Curb extensions
- ADA ramps and crosswalks
- Street lighting
- Traffic signal upgrades












SCHEME 1 – INTERSECTION




















Which lightpole identifier do you prefer?













Do you prefer a flexible paved space vs. a green space?
