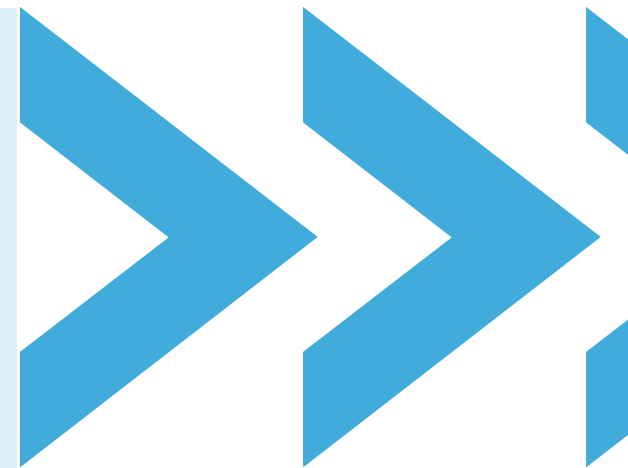

WHAT'S A FAMILY PRERAREDNESS PLAN?



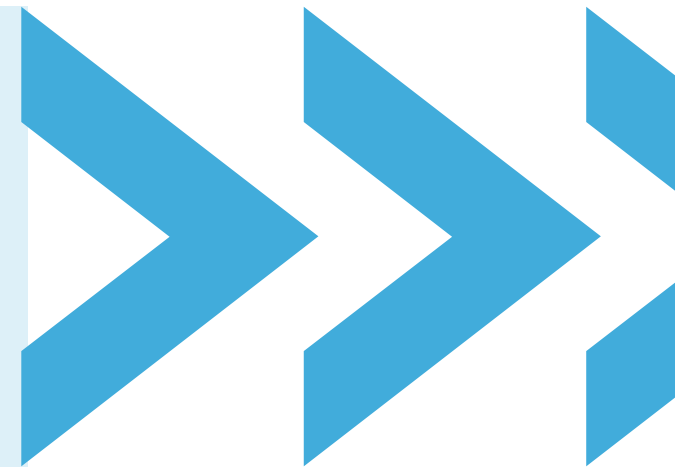
A Family Preparedness Plan offers **resources** and **tools** to help immigrant families plan for potential separation.

WHAT DOES A PLAN LOOK LIKE?

- **Talking** with your family or loved one about what to do in case of separation/emergency.
- **Creating** a binder or folder gathering important identification documents.
- **Arranging** guardianship for a loved one or a child.
- **Updating** emergency contact information with schools, doctors, and employers when traveling.



BUILD A PLAN: AVAILABLE RESOURCES



Local non-profit organizations have **PRINTABLE** and **FILLABLE** Family Preparedness Plan packets to provide a guideline for families to gather this information.

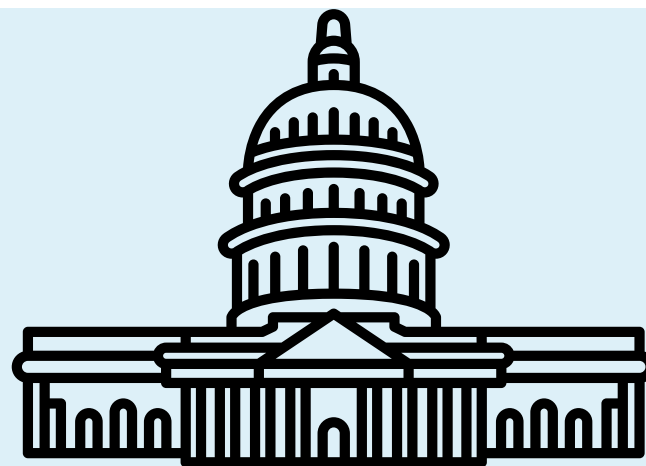

Upon request, federal Congressional offices can provide assistance to constituents navigating pending cases with federal agencies. Such as:

- Immigration related cases
- Social Security Office
- Internal Revenue Service
- and more

Filling out a Congressional support form will allow your federal elected representative to advocate on your behalf and inquire about your case directly with immigration authorities.

Upon request, **consulate offices** can offer support to nationals as they navigate the immigration system.

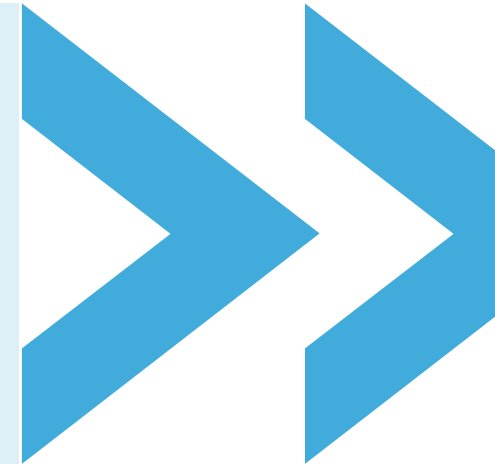
- Provides detainee support and resources
