#### Chicago tree updates

- No new trees have been planted since last month:
  - o 2025 totals: 4,940 trees so far this year (CDOT: 3,207, BOF: 1,733)
  - o 2025 goals: 10,000 trees (CDOT: 4,000, BOF: 6,000)
- Current work focusses on tree maintenance, warranty evaluation, and site selection for fall planting.
- Planting will resume when the temperature drops in late summer.

# Urban Wildlife Institute: Seth Mangle

- UWI—located at the Lincoln Park Zoo—studies wildlife in urban areas, with the goal of minimizing conflict between nature and people, to the betterment of both.

  - o 2322 trees planted
  - o 609 requested
  - 1029 trees inventoried

### **Openlands**

- Openlands will host a tree care day in North Lawndale at 2:00pm on August 27 –
   more information can be found by scanning the QR code on slide.
- Tree care days: Openlands works with partners to cohost tree care days. These workdays are intended to be zero-barrier-to-entry events to get people involved with trees in their community. Openlands provides tools and instruction. Contact Tom Ebling if you are interested in cohosting an event.
- Tree planter grants: Openlands plants roughly 1,200 trees per year and still has 200 unclaimed trees available for 2025. These trees can be planted in parkways or on private property. Reach out to Tom Ebling if you would like to organize a tree planting event.
