 - 1. Not sure if DFSS budget expectations match the 2025 numbers?
 - a. 19 million for incoming year
 - Too many unknowns currently to send out specifics for how the 19 million will be split, but once they get confirmations, they will release information
 - b. DV coordinated response, GBV hotel program, and training program RFP that are closed but currently being evaluated
 - c. There will come with the new RFP with prison education

- d. Built in flexibility for the city to respond to potential decreases that could come from the federal government?
- i. Internal groups working to see what that will look like
- ii. Developing communication with city, county, state and folks that filled these positions previously
 - e. ARPA + DV home share funds
 - i. Some programs were only one time funding
 - ii. Will be putting out all of the ARPA programs up to RFP this coming year
 - f. Is Human trafficking is counting exclusively as DV because they use DV services, but it is human trafficking?
 - Need numbers to get counted for human trafficking because they are all going to DV
 - ii. DFSS is asking programs to parse out who they are serving
- ii. When do you project you will have more information?
 - 1. Very tough time OBN is only just getting these numbers, so the timeframe is not exact right now
