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GRANTS UP TO \$150,000 FOR COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES GRANTS UP TO \$250,000 FOR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTIES

he Small Business Improvement **Fund (SBIF)** provides reimbursable grants to Chicago small businesses to make permanent building improvements and repairs.

Offered by the Chicago Department of Planning and Development (DPD) to tenants and owners of industrial and commercial properties, SBIF grants are funded by Tax Increment Financing (TIF) revenues in designated TIF districts citywide.

SBIF program participants can receive grants covering between 30 percent and 90 percent of eligible project costs.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A SBIF GRANT?

- Business properties located in TIF districts accepting applications for available SBIF funds.
- Commercial businesses with gross average annual sales up to \$9 million over the previous three years.
- Property owners or landlords with a net worth up to \$9 million and liquid assets up to \$500,000.
- Industrial businesses with up to 200 full-time employees.
- Residential properties are not eligible for SBIF grants.

HOW MUCH FUNDING IS AVAILABLE FOR PARTICIPATING BUSINESSES?

- Commercial projects are eligible for grants up to \$150,000.
- Industrial projects are eligible for grants up to \$250,000.
- SBIF grants are reimbursable. Funds are disbursed after approved projects are completed.





WHAT EXPENSES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR GRANT FUNDING?

Permanent building improvements are eligible for SBIF grants, including:

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- Electrical and plumbing system upgrades
- Mechanical/heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC)
- Tuck pointing and masonry repairs, façade repairs and improvements
- Roof repair and replacement
- Rehabilitation of vacant buildings
- Structural components of new signage ٠
- Alterations or structures needed for ADA compliance
- Project-related architectural and construction management fees

HOW DO I FIND OUT IF MY PROPERTY/BUSINESS IS LOCATED IN AN ELIGIBLE **TIF DISTRICT?**

Use the SBIF Locator Tool to determine if your property is in an eligible TIF district. The tool also includes application rollout dates and provides contact information for business assistance organizations that can help with the application process.

- Enter your address in box reading "Find address or place."

HOW DO I KNOW WHAT TIF DISTRICTS ARE OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS?

- Several TIF districts roll out to accept SBIF applications each month.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR A GRANT?

To apply for funding, eligible businesses must submit applications during the month-long rollout period for their TIF. Applications must be submitted to DPD's program administrator, SomerCor.
