Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) Specialty Clinics

These drop-in specialty clinics diagnose and treat sexually transmitted infections (STI), and provide information about condom use and other STI prevention methods. STI care at CDPH'S STI Specialty Clinics are offered at no cost, and on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Specially trained healthcare providers are available for the evaluation, testing and treatment of the following common STIs:

- chlamydia
- gonorrhea
- genital warts
- herpes
- non-gonococcal urethritis (NGU)
- syphilis
- vaginal infections (trichomoniasis, yeast, and bacterial vaginosis)

Testing and treatment services are available for many lesser known STIs like:

- chancroid
- crabs
- *lymphogranuloma venereum*
- *molluscum contagiosum*
- *mucopurulent cervicitis*
- pelvic inflammatory disease (PID)
- scabies

Hepatitis A and B immunizations are available. Confidential HIV counseling and testing is offered routinely to all persons seeking services. HIV Rapid Tests are available for same-day test results. Additionally, Fast Track STI/HIV services are available to those who qualify.
