



What Can I Recycle?

Fact Sheet

Residents in multi-unit buildings can recycle many materials, including paper, cardboard, plastics, glass and aluminum, by establishing a source-separated recycling program with their waste hauler. Below is a complete list of materials that generally can be recycled. Some haulers may have slightly different lists of accepted recyclables, so it's important to check with them first.

Containers	Paper Fiber	What is <u>Not</u> Accepted?
<p>All containers should be emptied.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil • Steel Cans & Tins • Milk & Juice Cartons • Milk & Juice Jugs (#2 clear plastic resin) • Glass Bottles and Jars - (clear, brown, green) No window glass, dinnerware or ceramics. • Pop, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin) • Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers (#2 colored plastic resin) • PVC Narrow Neck Containers, such as health & beauty aid products, household cleaners (#3 plastic resin) • Grocery Containers, such as six and twelve pack rings, margarine tubs, and frozen desert cups (#4 plastic resin) • Grocery Containers, such as yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles (#5 plastic resin) • #7 Plastic Resin Narrow Neck Containers • Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum) No metal handles. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves) • Cardboard (no waxed cardboard) • Kraft Bags (brown paper bags) • Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books • Office, Computer, Notebook & Gift Wrap Paper (no metal clips, spirals, binders) • Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes, etc.) • Carrier Stock (soda & beer can carrying cases) • Junk Mail & Envelopes (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps) • Paper Back Books (no hard cover books) <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Don't forget!</u> Flatten cardboard and chipboard boxes before recycling!</p>	<p>You <u>CANNOT</u> recycle the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Motor oil containers • Insecticide containers • Herbicide containers • Hazardous chemical containers • Plastic bags or film (plastic sheets, tarps or wrap) • Expanded foam (Styrofoam) • Clear polystyrene (#6 plastic) • Soiled napkins, towels or disposable diapers • Batteries • Dog/cat waste • Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs (CFL) • Clothes • Printer or toner cartridges
