In your letter dated July 22, 1987, you informed the Board that you are an associate attorney employed by a local law firm, and that result of your responsibilities at the law firm you may be classified as a "lobbyist" for purposes of the Governmental Ethics Ordinance (Chapter 26.2 of the Municipal Code of Chicago). You also informed the Board that as an associate attorney, you did not have access to information regarding the compensation received or expenditures made by the law firm for which you work and as a result of this lack of information, you do not believe that you can accurately complete a Lobbyist Registration Form.

Realizing that your dilemma is shared by hundreds of attorneys who practice in the City of Chicago, the Board of Ethics has determined that associate attorneys are not required to file a Lobbyist Registration Form. Instead, the law firm will be responsible for filing one Registration Form on behalf of all the partners and associates in the firm who engage in lobbying activities. This recently enacted policy was printed in the "Chicago Daily Law Bulletin" in the Legal Notice Section from Monday, August 10, 1987 until Friday August 14, 1987. For your information, a copy of this notice is enclosed.
