### MINUTES [Draft]

**Board Members Present**: President Lori E. Lightfoot, Vice President Ghian Foreman (via audio conference), Eva-Dina Delgado, Michael Eaddy (via audio conference), Steve Flores, Rita A. Fry, John P. O'Malley Jr., John H. Simpson, and Rhoda D. Sweeney.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: First Deputy Superintendent of Police Kevin Navarro, Chicago Police Department Deputy Director Tina Skahill, Independent Police Review Authority Chief Administrator Sharon Fairley, and members of the public.

President Lightfoot called the meeting to order. She reported that Vice President Foreman and Rev. Eaddy are not able to attend the meeting in person and wish to attend via audio conference. Ms. Delgado moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Delgado, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.

- 1. Ms. Fry moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on February 16, 2017. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- 2. President Lightfoot announced that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 20, 2017, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters. Mr. O'Malley moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- 3. President Lightfoot stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and she noted that this report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website.

- 4. President Lightfoot announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books and are available on the Police Department's website.
- 5. President Lightfoot noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Ms. Sweeney moved that the oral presentation be waived, and that the report be received in writing. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Lightfoot, Delgado, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed.
- 6. President Lightfoot called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.)
  - Henry Pettigrew stated that he is a former Chicago police officer and offered suggestions on the assignment of officers in the districts.
  - EvAngel YHWHnewBN commented on several matters.
  - Queen Sister spoke about a variety of matters.
  - Crista Noel spoke about police-involved shootings and the Police Department's use-of-force policy.
  - George Blakemore spoke about a variety of matters.
  - President Lightfoot called upon Robert More and there was no response.

President Lightfoot stated that all persons that had signed up in advance to speak had been called. Mr. Simpson moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, Fry, O'Malley, Simpson, and Sweeney) to 0 opposed, and President Lightfoot announced that the meeting is adjourned.

## Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by the Public at Board Meetings

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
- 2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
- 3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
- 4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

### PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **MARCH 2017**, **159** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **34,796** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Body Worn Camera Orientation Program, Force Mitigation/Crisis Recognition & Response, LEMART, C50 Avon Gas Mask Training, Prescribed Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy, Power Test, Patrol Carbine Requalification A, TASER Qualification and Re-Certification, Firearms Concealed Carry Act Online Course, Body Warn Cameras: Supervisory Duties, Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) Familiarization, Directives: February 2017, Domestic Violence 4-Part Refresher, First Amendment Online Training, Suspicious Activity Reporting (SAR) Line Officer Training, Use of Force Parts 1-4, Gang Violence Reduction Strategy.

A total of 433 Chicago Police Recruits were in training along with 52 Lieutenants, 138 Detectives, 143 Sergeants, 69 Field Training Officers and 17 Metropolitan Police Recruits.
